

New Business:


Rick – talked about putting together a Grant Committee and that John G. was willing to chair it. He would be in charge of putting it together.

This message is a friendly reminder regarding safety regulations at the North Texas Field and Stream (NWTFS) ranges. To ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone, please take a moment to familiarize yourself with the specific rules for each shooting range.

Each of our ranges, varying in distance from 15 to 100 yards, have unique safety protocols in place. Clearly marked signage at each range details these specific requirements. While we want everyone to have fun and enjoy their time at NWTFS, it's important to understand that violations of these safety regulations can have serious consequences. Unfortunately, recent incidents captured on our range cameras have highlighted the need for increased vigilance. These incidents are being addressed promptly and appropriately.

JANUARY 2025 RIFLE MATCH

The January rifle match was almost cold enough to need gloves. The winter morning sun is always at the wrong angle, casting shade over the target line and shining into the eyes, further restricting contrast.

The past few times James Lovingier attended, he was in high spirit until realizing Jon Scales showed up - "Well, I've got 2nd place locked!"

This time Jon had his M1903A3 zeroed for a reduced load, but not much practice with it. Mark Johnson tried some homebrewed boolits in his 7.62 side-charged AR15. The Standing position is not James' forte, but he started with the lead and increased the margin at each stage, including a clean 100 from Sitting.

After Sitting, four of us formed a mid-pack behind James. Brian Davis with 93, Roy Woodman and Jon with 91-1x, and myself with 91. Jon had the most interesting string, as round #5 popped out of the magazine. He stored it between his lips, charged the rifle, fired those 5 rounds, thumbed that single round in and finished just in time. Pat Mitchell began to struggle with a lack of eye relief in Prone, but maintained a good, consistent ~85%. I did not have that struggle, so maintained ~90%. Roy had a great Prone Rapid of 97-1x, but Brian began to ascend with 99-4x. At this point the sun was no longer in our eyes. The light did not shine directly on the targets, but reflected some off the ground onto the targets. Even with scopes, the perception of target center - your zero - can change. Several of us drifted a little left/high-left.

The next matches will be on 7-Feb, 7-Mar, and 4-Apr. Bring 50 shots for record.

Youth Trap Shooting Certification Course

to Start February 17, 2026

Once again the Northwest Texas Field & Stream Association will provide a Youth Trap Shooting Certification Course for Boys & Girls ages 8 years old (and in the 3rd Grade) to 18 years old.

This is an 11-week course with classes held every Tuesday from February 17th until April 28th.

The initial class on February 17th is from 6:00-8:30 PM and is mandatory for first year participants.

All course participants will learn the proper techniques and safety elements involved in using a firearm and the rules and expectations of the course.

The following classes will be held every Tuesday from 4:00 - 6:00 PM. These classes will be one-on-one, hands-on instruction.

The course will conclude with a graduation ceremony on Tuesday, April 28th . All classes will be held at the Northwest Texas Field & Stream Association Gun Range on Old Friberg Road.


